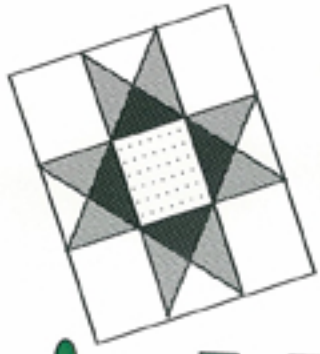


# Panel Discussion on Blacks in Montréal and Québec
